

The authoryear-ibid style

This citation style is a variant of the **authoryear** style. Immediately repeated citations are replaced by the abbreviation ‘ibidem’ unless the citation is the first one on the current page or double page spread (depending on the setting of the **pagetracker** package option). This style is intended for citations given in footnotes. If you want terms such as ‘ibidem’ to be printed in italics, redefine `\mkibid` as follows:

```
\renewcommand*{\mkibid}{\emph}
```

Note that ‘ibidem’ is sometimes taken to mean both ‘same author+title’ and ‘same author+title+page’. By default, this is not the case in this style because it may lead to ambiguous citations. If you prefer the alternative interpretation of ‘ibidem’, set the package option `ibidpage=true` or simply `ibidpage` in the preamble.
